RESOLUTION NO. 2020-123

**A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING
THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT THE CODORNICES CREEK
PHASE IV PROJECT FOR FUNDING FROM ALAMEDA COUNTY
TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION AS PART OF THE
2022 COMPREHENSIVE INVESTMENT PLAN**

WHEREAS, the City of Albany has partnered with the City of Berkeley and the University of California since the late 1990s to restore the portion of lower Codornices Creek between San Pablo Avenue and the train tracks as a vital riparian habitat and a resource to the community; and

WHEREAS, the first three phases of the project have been completed successfully; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2012, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2012-25, adopting the Albany Active Transportation Plan following a two-year community planning process; and

WHEREAS, the Albany Active Transportation Plan identifies the Codornices Creek Path as a top tier highest-priority project; and

WHEREAS, the path between 10th Street and San Pablo Avenue and the High-Intensity Activated Crosswalk Beacon at San Pablo Avenue have been installed, leaving the 8th Street to 10th Street segment as the last remaining path segment to be completed; and


WHEREAS, on October 21, 2019, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2019-86 accepting final plans for Phase IV of the Codornices Creek project, which

1 includes a bicycle and pedestrian shared-use path from 8th-10th Streets, a crossing at 8th
2 street to link to the Phase III project, and minor vegetation improvements; and

4 **WHEREAS**, on November 2, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No.
5 2020-108 authorizing the adoption of the FY2019/20 – 2023/24 Capital Improvement
6 Plan and appropriating \$620,000 in funds toward the Codornices Creek Phase IV project
7 in FY 2021/22, partially funding the project; and

9 **WHEREAS**, City staff has determined that Codornices Creek Phase IV is the most
10 competitive project candidate for the Alameda County Transportation Commission 2022
11 Comprehensive Investment Plan.

13 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Albany City Council
14 authorizes the City Manager to submit the Codornices Creek Phase IV project for funding
15 in the Alameda County Transportation Commission 2022 Comprehensive Investment
16 Plan.
